Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of the academic year, I wanted to take this opportunity to update you on our progress towards our school vision.

Area for Development	Actions Taken and Developments for September
Celebrating and sharing success	This year, children in the winning house team have been rewarded at the end of each term. In September the children will be put into new house teams and will earn individual points as well as house points. The children earning 150 points or more during the year will be rewarded in the Summer Term, in addition to the team reward.
Developing a nurturing culture and good standards of behaviour	The development of Circle Time and staff training around therapeutic approaches has further enhanced the children's already good behaviour. The Hive will be moving as part of the building work, to a new larger space where the school kitchen is currently.
Develop positive relationships with parents and carers	This term KS1 held a very successful Fair Trade Café. Thank you to all the parents who supported this event. We are planning more opportunities like this next year. We are also planning Class Assemblies to share the children's work with you.
Further enriching the curriculum through first hand experiences and quality resources	The curriculum has continued to be enhanced by providing children with quality first-hand experiences such as the chicks hatching in KS1, and the UKS2 visit to look at coastal erosion. TESCO continue to support the school by providing sessions that enhance and enrich our curriculum. Children across school have accessed Woodland sessions which have been a huge success. This will continue next year.
Working collaboratively with cluster schools and local groups to build a better future for our community	Working together with local schools we have been able to plan a better transition to secondary schools for our Y6 children. Teachers work together across the schools to moderate their judgements around your children's learning and progress. We will further develop these relationships next year with subject leaders working together to enhance the curriculum.

Changes for 2016

There will be significant and exciting changes to the building during the break. The new Nursery will be situated in what was the Children's Centre Day Care. This room is being remodelled and decorated ready for September. An additional classroom is being created in KS1, and new Well-being Team offices and The Hive will be in the newly transformed old kitchens. A new state of the art kitchen will be located at the back of the hall. With the new provision areas and additional children, we have made some changes to the school day.

Breakfast Club

Wake and Shake activities will be incorporated into the normal Breakfast Club session. Breakfast Club will start at 8.15am for all children wanting to attend. Please supervise children outside until this time.

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Lunchtimes

Our lunchtimes will look quite different in September, each phase will go in separately for their lunch in the new dining hall with separate stations for dinners, jacket potatoes and desserts.

EYFS children will continue to access the play area at the back of school and this will be zoned to include a quiet area, games area and physical area.

Children across KS1 and KS2 will access a lunchtime club of their choosing either before their lunch for KS2, or after for KS1. The children have signed up for the clubs that interest them on their transition days.

Club leaders will collect children and run clubs as voted for by the school council. Lunchtime clubs include: performing arts, skipping, sports, football, ipads/computers, lego, board games and drawing.

Children will access a different club each day until October half term when we will review the clubs on offer.

Site Security and Safety

Over the holiday, a new security gate will be put in at the top of the drive. Along with the fencing this will make the site safer for our children. The new gate will be open until 8.30am and will then be closed until 3.30pm. If you or your child have a disabled pass, you will be able to buzz the office to be let in. Please take extra care on the drive and playground if bringing your children to Breakfast Club in the car. Fencing will separate the path from the driveway increasing safety for children and parents.
