A really simple way to get children counting 1s, 2s, 5s, 10s etc, is skip counting. Skip counting is fun to do and children begin to hear patterns in numbers.



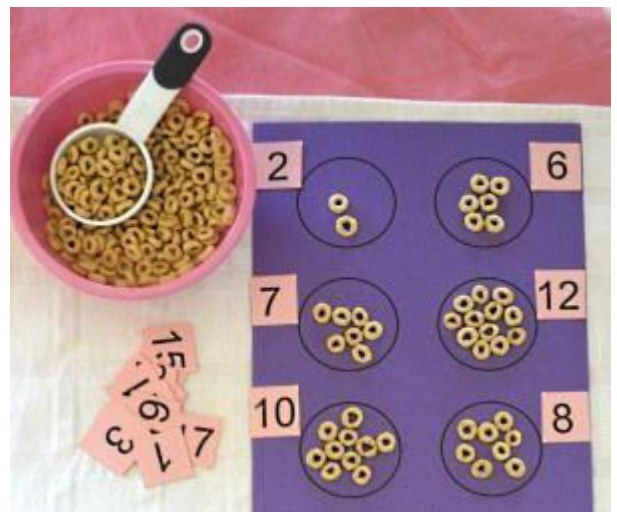
